UNESCO keeps getting bandied around as the cause of our woes but the problem is, they only have input into the management of the Great Barrier Reef which is a long way from the Gulf of Carpentaria. Carpentaria Shire have lodged a submission to the Department this week and I'm guessing it will be on the website so have a read. If there are any more groups out there with an interest in our future feel free to put in more objections to the harm this will do to our communities in the Shire.

WET SEASON PREPARATIONS

Carpentaria Shire, it's time to GET READY! We are asking residents to think about how extreme weather could impact your life, make a plan to stay safe, and pack supplies so you don't get caught out.

Think about packing:

- Long-life food and toiletries in case you can't get to the shops.
- Drinking water in case the water supply stops working.
- Batteries, a torch and radio in case the power goes out.

These are the basics, but also consider what other items your family might use if you had to stay at home for multiple days.

There are other things you can do to be ready for extreme weather:

- Clean-up – Check around the house and yard and make sure your home will hold up against the elements.
- Sign-up – Subscribe to mobile weather notifications from the Bureau of Meteorology so you're informed and can act quickly.
- Connect – Know your neighbours and connect with your community.
- Get covered – Check your insurance to make sure your property can be fixed or replaced if it's damaged.


