Section G – Information for Dog Owners

Under the *Local Government Act 2009*, a local government may make and enforce any local law that is necessary or convenient for the good rule and local government of its local government area.

Matters relating to the keeping of animals are prescribed in *Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2015* and *Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2015*.

Carpentaria Shire Council is responsible for administering relevant provisions of the *Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008 (the Act)*.

The registration requirements for dogs in Carpentaria Shire include mandatory registration, microchipping and tattooing of desexed animals.

Registration

The Act requires responsible person to ensure dogs are:

- registered by the time they are 12 weeks old; and/or
- have their registration transferred within 14 days of moving to Carpentaria Shire.

Permanent Identification Device (PID) (Microchipping)

Dogs must be microchipped when:

- sold (seller's responsibility);
- given away (responsibility of the person giving the animal away);
- before reaching the age of 12 weeks.

Benefits of Microchipping

A microchip is about the size of a grain of rice and can be implanted by a local vet. The barcode contains your contact details which are recorded on the Central Animal Records (CAR) database for the life of your pet. This means your pet is permanently identified Australia-wide and can be safely returned to you even if there is no collar or Council registration tag. Once you have microchipped your pet, you will receive an external tag and a certificate of identification posted to you.

Maintaining Microchip Information

Whenever you move address, contact your microchip registry to update your details as soon as possible. This will increase the chance of being reunited with your pet should they become lost.

Tattooing of De-sexed Pets

A small tattoo is required to be placed on the inside ear of the dog at the time they are de-sexed to identify the animal

as being de-sexed.

Conditions of Registration

If more than four (4) dogs over the age of 3 months are kept at the same premises, written application must be made to the Council for approval.

It shall be a condition of registration that every registered dog shall, AT ALL TIMES, have a collar around its neck with the registered tag attached thereto and every dog that does not have a registered tag attached shall be deemed to be unregistered and may be dealt with as such by an Authorised Officer of the Council.

Regulated Dog

Carpentaria Shire Council may declare your animal dangerous or menacing if it:

- has bitten or attacked a person or another animal
- was trained or kept as a guard dog
- was declared dangerous or menacing by another local government

Once your animal has been declared dangerous or menacing, you will need to comply with conditions as prescribed by legislation.

Working Dog

Means a dog usually kept or proposed to be kept on rural land and by an owner who is a primary producer or engaged or employed by a primary producer and primarily is used or being trained for the purpose of droving, protecting, tending or working stock. (This excludes a Regulated Dog).
