QLD Local Roads & Community Infastructure Program



On 22 May 2020 the Australian Government announced a new \$500 million Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCI Program).

This program will support local councils to deliver priority local road and community infrastructure projects across Australia, supporting jobs and the resilience of local economies to help communities bounce back from the COVID-19 pandemic.

As part of this program Council received an additional \$711,924 in funding to contribute to our Roads and Infrastructure Programs.

This additional funding will provide valuable support to our program and keepnig locals actively engaged in employment.

Libraries

In May, the Normanton Library was successful in receiving \$3,000 from the 2019-20 Strategic Priorities Micro Grant for the Children Furniture Project.

A Bit about this Project...

This project focuses on improving the seating and storage in the children's area. This will not only benefit the under 5 children but will also make the area more welcoming for parents and older children who will also be able to enjoy the improved space. With more storage space more activities can happen in the children's area.

Child Care Learns Sustainability







Council's Daycare have been looking at ways to be sustainable with the children. They started this process by planting some vegetables and herbs. The children have helped with each step of the process.

The first step was to prepare the garden bed by digging out the weeds with rakes. They spoke about how the plants need clean dirt to grow in. Some of the boys made up a song to go along with gardening called "If you're happy and you know it Dig! Dig!"

Once the garden bed was ready the children helped plant the vegetables and herbs in the ground. Some of the children noticed things hanging from the bottom of the plant and asked what it was for. We talked about how they are roots and the plants need them to grow. They were very careful from then on to not hurt the roots so they can grow nice and big.

We have read books about gardening which taught us that for plants to grow, they need sunlight and water. The children continue to help the plants by watering them each day and checking that no new weeds have grown. This is a great way for the children to learn to respect their environment and learn about life skills and life cycles.

Pensioner Application for Council Remission and State Government Subsidy on Rates

(PLEASE NOTE: IF YOU ARE ALREADY IN RECEIPT OF THIS CONCESSION AND YOU ARE STILL THE HOLDER OF A CARD YOU ARE NOT REQUIRED TO RE-SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FORM).



To be eligible for the **State Government Rate Subsidy** you must meet all of the following criteria:

- Be the holder of a Queensland "Pensioner Concession Card" issued by Centrelink or the Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA), or a Queensland "Repatriation Health Card-For All Conditions" issued by the Department of Veterans' Affairs; and
- Be the sole or joint owner or life tenant of the property which is your principal place of residence; and
- Have sole or joint legal responsibility for the payment of rates and charges as defined in the guidelines*.

(*Administrative Guidelines for the Queensland Government's Pensioner Rate Subsidy Scheme)

To be eligible for the Council Rate Subsidy you must:

- Be the holder of a Commonwealth Aged Pension or DVA equivalent card;
- · Have lived in the Shire for at least 10 years; and
- Any arrears of rates and charges associated must be paid in full.

Applications should be lodged with Council by the 29 July 2020.
