Again, there are many houses in both towns that have unused Bigpond, Austar, Foxtel and probably more, satellite dishes already in their yards. We will get and keep on file some contacts for people to talk to regarding the change.

One other thing I'd like to address this month is to clear up a couple of misconceptions and or myths regarding closed roads and crossings during flooding events. We keep the penalties out of the signage so that people can have a fish and go for a drive without being fined. This does not mean that you can cross flooded rivers once they exceed the TMR limits. Resupply freight companies operate under a different ruling because it saves the government a heap of money to do it this way and also keeps the shelves in your supermarkets stocked up. It gets confusing when not all roads are closed and there are no resupply subsidies.

Resupply only means that you the consumer have no extra freight costs added to what is the normal rate. Nothing is free. It would be a good idea if you haven't already, to have a look on the Council Website and read what is Resupply and also see what is deemed essential. You will probably get a surprise. Also, while we're on the subject of freight, I would like to point out that Australia Post DO NOT answer to Council, and we have no jurisdiction in that space at all. If you have issues with Australia Post, Telstra or BOM for that matter, take it up with themselves or your Federal member. We do pass your comments on, but one voice makes no difference. You, the General Public need to voice your concerns through your Federal members as well as us (all 3 agencies are Federal issues). Having said that though, if ever there is a genuine emergency or need for unavailable medication, please do not hesitate to contact us, either at the front counter or your Councillors. We will get them to you somehow.

Remember we live on a flood plain pretty much surrounded by water and mangroves during the wet which equates to a "squillion" mossies at any one time. This is nature at its best and try as we might there is no amount of spraying or poisoning that will totally remove these critters. Old time favorites such as coils, Rid and citronella lanterns are the best way to help yourself. If there is an outbreak of any insect borne diseases or such then Qld Health are quick to respond and get the message out including using Council.

I think I have used up my space around about now, so I had better sign off for this month. Remember, fingers crossed for some more rain and keep your eyes and ears open for dates and times on our upcoming Normanton public meeting.

Mosquito Season

Reducing Mosquitoes in your Backyard is important during the wet. You can do a lot to reduce mosquito numbers around the houses by:

- Throwing out containers in the yard that hold water
- Changing water in bird baths and pet bowls frequently;
- Cleaning roof gutters on a regular basis;
- Emptying pot plant saucers every week or filling them with sand;
- Keeping swimming pools clean and chlorinated;
- Keeping ornamental ponds / fountains stocked with fish

When conditions permit, Council will continue the fogging program.

- Review the latest Disaster Information Handbook on our website and the new Resupply Information Brochure
- Check weather warning and updates on the **Bureau of Meteorology** website.
- Act quickly on instruction and advice given by council and other authorities.
- Check with emergency authorities (such as Rural Fire and Emergency Services).
- Empty buckets and containers which could be breeding grounds for mosquitoes.
- Review Council's **Road Report**, and remember if it's Flooded, FORGET IT.
