MAYOR'S MESSAGE

I don't really have much to add to this newsletter as the "Council Scribe" has done a very thorough job of updating you with all our good news stories so I will start off with a bit of damage control before it starts.

As stated further on, with Budget raising its head again very soon there will be a chance for the public to give their opinions to the accounting and rates team this week at the Shire Hall in Normanton and the Civic Centre in Karumba (Dates and times are in this newsletter). They will be doing their normal duties remotely as well, so please don't think that it's a holiday for them and remember they are there to help and advise as well. If you are in doubt or still feel the need to have the two-part tariff with water explained again, please come in and ask. One question we need answered is whether people want their water bill sent out 6 monthly or 12 monthly. At the moment it is going to be a 12 month slug so I personally, would rather a half year bill included with the rates. The Mayor and Councillors are going to make themselves available when possible so if you wish we can be part of the conversation as well. Remember, no question is a

dumb question, and no opinion is a dumb opinion so come on down. Remember to have a look at the planned projects also.



One bit of good news that I can pass on is another round of DRFA funding worth a million dollars each to Boulia, Burke, Carpentaria and Doomadgee. This is jointly funded by Federal and State Government and again is about "resilience" (my favourite word.....not) and betterment. A good project for this money would be more work on the Karumba Foreshore, if it is eligible. Given the fact that every event, whether its flood, cyclone or tropical depression causing erosion and eating away at our coastline every year, eligibility shouldn't be a problem. We shall see. In any case it won't be hard to find another worthwhile cause if the foreshore protection doesn't stack up.

We have been very fortunate with funding over the last few years (There is a huge one up North

that hasn't seen a Media Release yet) and skills/labour shortages are making it extremely difficult to meet deadlines, but we are pulling out all stops to make it work. The outdoor crews and contractors have been slow to get in full swing because of surface water and boggy conditions but as the country dries out they are reaching full stride. Even getting through the sand bank (wall) at the Leichhardt River has been a marathon exercise but finally it is open (one lane only) and traffic is starting to flow along the top road again. Another early and extended wet like the last one is something that we would rather not have this year until all our deadlines are met and we have consolidated a bit, but nature is nature, and we will always be grateful for our rainy season regardless.

In respect to Lillyvale. The CEO and I had a meeting with the agent and he has advised to do expressions of interest first and then move to a contract. Council's immediate job now that the drainage problems are being rectified, is to mark the blocks clearly at the front and also make the rear line known. Once that is done he (the agent) will come out and walk the country to familiarise himself with the lay out and then the notices and advertising will start. After all this time we are going to finally see some action.

I (and most of the town I think) went to the first football cluster for the season and it was so good to see the younger generation stepping up into roles that had the older or should I say, more mature members of our community run to a frazzle. Having said that I did see one of those more mature persons running up and down the field with a whistle in hand so we're not dead yet. Well done to everyone involved. The stayers even got to witness our touch of sci fi in the gulf with the asteroid lighting up quite a few surprised faces after the games.

With the cold weather closing in fast, tourist vehicles and cattle truck movements are not slowing down and the increased traffic on all roads are always going to be a risk. Again, I urge everyone to be mindful of drop offs on the edges/verges and give way to the big rigs by getting off the road totally, where possible. Having said that I'll sign off until next time.

To ensure a fair and transparent electoral process, the CEO has developed an Election Guideline for Staff Policy and a template Election Management Plan. These resources are designed to assist Council employees (including contractors and volunteers) who are interested in becoming candidates in the upcoming local government elections.

If you are a Council employee (including contractors and volunteers) and plan to stand as a candidate, it is crucial that you inform your Manager and Director as soon as possible. For further details and to access additional information, please reach out to your manager or directly contact the CEO.

DOG REGISTRATION RENEWAL

Dog registration is mandatory for all residents of Normanton and Karumba. Annual Renewal Registration forms will be sent by mail this week to owners with current dog registrations. If the information on the renewal notice is correct, kindly sign and return the form to the Council office to receive your new tag.

If the details are incorrect, please update your information at the bottom of the form and return it to the Council office. Your details will be updated, and you will be issued a new tag.

If your completed form is returned by June 30, 2023, the dog registration renewal will be free of charge for the next year. However, if it is returned after this date, a fee of \$22 will be applicable.

If your dog has passed away or if you are planning to move away from the shire, please inform the Council so that our system can be updated accordingly.

Keeping your details up to date will assist Council Rangers in identifying lost pets and reuniting them with their families. If your dog isn't currently registered, simply fill out a registration form online and return it to the Council. PROJECTS

Mitchell River Crossing

Over \$20 million has been made available to the Carpentaria Shire Council to repair the vital crossing over the Mitchell River following flood damage during the severe monsoon across Queensland's Gulf country.

The assistance is being provided through the jointly funded Commonwealth-State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) to fund emergency clean-up and repair costs.

The Mitchell River Crossing Investigation project is progressing with preliminary geotechnical investigations being performed to guide options analysis and structural design.

Wi-SKY UPDATE

Council received an exciting update that work on the Wi-sky project is moving forward smoothly. The tower feet have been successfully completed to Clarina, just south of Glenore. With everything going according to plan, we anticipate reaching Normanton and Karumba by August or September.

To ensure seamless implementation, we will be working closely with Wi-Sky to develop an agreement for the mounting of equipment at the water towers in Normanton and Karumba. This partnership will play a crucial role in supporting and enhancing the project.
