


MAYOR'S MESSAGE

How things have changed over the last couple of weeks. Up until Easter it was doubtful as to whether the fishing competition would be a success or not due to roads and river heights and here we are now with the Normanton Barra Classic successfully done and dusted with only a few nominations short of last year. The locals I spoke with assured me there were plenty of fish out there even though the record breakers weren't that plentiful. I think a lot of eskies got filled up in the week before and during Easter.

Karumba has been going gangbusters also with bag limits on King Salmon and Barramundi being reached in record times. It's a terrible state of affairs, when you have to target other species a couple of days into your 2-week pilgrimage to the fishing Mecca of Australia. The "Banana Season" has also proven to be a huge one with tons of prawns being caught and freighted out. This proves once again the local's theory that a drought on land is a drought in the sea and extended periods of flooding flushes the rivers and swamps out, which are the breeding grounds for all our famous species up here.

We had our Normanton public consultation the other night and it was good to see quite a few there. One of the topics that took quite a bit of time was our juvenile crime in Normanton. It is

a subject that can be discussed for hours on end and we can blame Police, Council, and any other number of agencies but at the end of the day, until the State or the Feds (or both) put some rules around "Parenting" we are flogging a dead horse. It all comes back to Welfare and the need to manage it in a way that promotes good parenting.

Another comment from the same meeting prompted me to do a bit of a quick audit of the streets around Normanton. Yes, there is a 10-year resealing programme for our streets in both towns but it's not a reseal that is required at the moment. All our busy streets need shoulder repair work done asap and I believe this is something that could be fitted into our works programme once end of year deadlines are met and acquitted. As a point of interest, we come up looking pretty good when our town and streets in general are compared to bigger places if you take note as you drive through them.

As for Tutt Bryant, they have been leaving their equipment in our Depot since about 2011-2012 (which is well before this Councils time) and in those days, I wasn't interested except that it made good sense to save on transport costs toing and froing every year (I'm sure their fitters would much rather be doing the servicing in the comfort of their own workshop as well). We also use their gensets and other items of plant over the closure on a regular basis when required. The CEO is organising the correct data for the remaining questions of the auction etc. so that will be available soon.

We won't dwell on that anymore. The good news is that work has started with camps being mobilised immediately after ANZAC Day and it is full steam ahead to achieve all our end of

financial year deadlines. During a quick drive to Augustus yesterday early, then around to have a look at the Leichhardt Crossing and home via the Burketown Road, I was pleasantly surprised at the condition of the roads. The crews have done a great job of the opening grades and repairs where needed. Mind you it's going to be awhile before the Leichhardt crossing is open to all vehicles. There is sand banked up this side to a depth of at least 10 metres in the river itself and it is still quite soft. How the poor old loader driver gets his bearings is a mystery, but they are well and truly into the river now.

Again, with the work's programme, locals have first bite of the cherry as per normal so everyone one should be working within the first 3 weeks or close to it. Cattle truck movements have begun as well so I would like to remind everyone to be mindful of the soft and sometimes scoured edges on our roads at present and when confronted by a road train, remember if he is bigger than you, give him the road and get out of the way.

I'm running late as usual, so I'll sign of until next month.

MOSQUITOS

With the completion of the recent treatments and the stabilising of the weather, any future treatments will only be conducted as per request.

NORMANTON LIBRARY & BURNS PHILP BUILDING

The Normanton Library has been closed from February to April for essential repairs. Unfortunately, the presence of mould has been detected in the building, requiring professional cleaning before it can be safely reopened. However, we are pleased to report that rectification works are currently underway, and we anticipate the library to reopen in May. We apologise for any inconvenience caused by this closure and appreciate your patience and understanding during this time.

ROAD REPORT

The road recently experienced flood damage, however it has since been restored.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

The Normanton Community Consultation meeting was held on the 26th of April at the Shire Hall. The purpose of the community consultation was to discuss Normanton specific issues. Approximately 45 people were in attendance. While there were no questions received prior to the meeting there were plenty of questions from the floor.

Questions in relation to Council services were raised in the areas of the process for the sale of land due to rate arrears, street lighting, the Council Auction of surplus plant and equipment, 10-year repeal program, the sale of land at the Lilyvale Rural Residential Estate and the Cemetery.

Questions were also raised in relation to the Hospital Development, the Youth Crime that still occurs within Normanton, the Adopt a Cop program, potential bans for youth, and the possibility of introducing Private Security, these items are the responsibility of other providers including the State Government, however the Council recognises that this is a concern for the community, and we will continue our advocacy efforts on the communities behalf.
